Eligibility / How to Access
Adults; intake assessment required; accepts many payers and state-funded options.
Call 877-HOPE123 for intake; insurance/sliding options vary by program.
Adults; call for intake; no/low cost depending on program.
School-age youth; membership/registration required; scholarships often available.
Income-based (federal guidelines); child must be age 3 or 4 before Aug 15; documentation required.
Same as above (income-based); apply through SCHRA.
Income-based; prenatal & early childhood; apply through SCHRA.
Adults with opioid use disorder; intake assessment required; accepts many payers.
Adults; call for program intake; no/low cost depending on program.
Open to anyone seeking help or information.
Income-based assistance; call billing for financial counselor to apply.
Income-based; bring ID, proof of income, SS cards, and documentation of need.
Maury County residents; appointment required; bring ID, SS cards, proof of income/benefits, and bill/lease.
Typically photo ID; call to confirm documentation and current hours.
Maury County residents. Photo ID required; if ID lacks Maury address, bring recent mail to verify.
Walk-in during serving times; all are welcome.
Bring a photo ID on first visit to register; households may visit regularly per pantry policy.
HIV testing available to the public; case management for people living with HIV. Call for intake.
Varies by program; many services low/no cost. Call for appointments and documentation needed.
Open to all; financial assistance based on need—call billing for a financial counselor (option 4).
Income-qualified households per HUD rules; SSNs; citizenship/eligible non-citizen; apply via CHRC—waiting lists may be closed.
Income-qualified; willingness to partner and complete sweat equity; apply online or at office.
Adults; intake assessment required. Many programs free/no charge; call for availability.
Adults experiencing homelessness; capacity and schedule vary—call church office to confirm.

Open to all; intake by phone 877-HOPE123; accepts many insurances; sliding scale for some programs.
Open to all; Medicaid/TennCare and other insurance accepted; call for intake.
All services free & confidential; call or book online for appointment.
All services free & confidential; call or book online for appointment.
Ages 60+; register as a client; small rider donation suggested.
General public; fares apply; schedule rides by phone (usually 24–48 hrs ahead).
For CPWS customers in hardship; typically coordinated through The Family Center—call CPWS for referral.
Income-based; bring ID, proof of income, SS cards, utility bill/lease; apply at NSC.
